If your abstract is selected you will be notified by the 19th August and at that time you will be asked to confirm that you can:

- 1 attend the conference and present your paper in an agreed format either on 12th or 13th September.
- 2 attend the event on the day selected for your presentation by the conference organisers. Attendance at the gala dinner and second day will be charged.

How to Submit an Abstract

You may submit one or more abstracts by filling out the entry form.

This year the judging panel is encouraging submissions to be accompanied by a podcast. However, papers will be accepted and judged without one.

- 1 The podcast should be no more than 5 minutes long
- 2 The aim of the podcast is to provide judges with an expert overview about the paper and should be a useful standalone communication
- 3 Papers featured at the conference will have 'their' podcasts uploaded onto the ACT TravelWise website
- 4 At the beginning of the podcast please include your name, position, organisation, contact details and name of the paper

Future Technologies - making sense of them

Organisations are increasingly considering and implementing options for reducing or removing the need to travel. DfT are investing time and effort in the development and promotion of the policy area 'Alternatives to Travel'. Alternatives to travel are measures such as teleconferencing, webinars, flexible working, remote working and more.

Intelligent Transport Systems are a combination of Information Technology and telecommunications, allowing the provision of on-line information in all areas of public and private administration. Provision of on-line information to bus and train passengers creates a better informed traveller. Electronic ticketing (by means of Smartcards, for example) enables faster and easier travel by public transport.

Increasingly electric and hybrid vehicles are becoming prominent in the transport mix. Europe, the UK and car auto manufacturers are investing considerable amounts of money into their development and launch.

Future technologies provide sustainable transport practitioners with a bewildering array of measures which will reduce congestion, emissions and the bottom line.

This seminar will provide delegates with the opportunity to make sense of the options and what they can achieve. Funding and income generation - where are the opportunities?

Budgets have been slashed and in some places eradicated and it looks like it will be some

time before the money will flow again.
