WHAT CAR DRIVERS NEED TO KNOW ABOUT THE NEW EMISSION ZONES

Creating cleaner, healthier cities.

- The UK Government is committed to improving the quality of the air we all breathe.
- Emission Zones are special areas coming to some towns and cities, created to help achieve this
 by either restricting some high-emission vehicles from entering the zone, or charging them.
- Private cars are often not included— and even when they are, only older models are
 affected. So for many drivers, there's no need to worry.
- Local Authorities decide on the rules for their zone and the vehicles it applies to, depending
 upon the air quality in their area. This will be very clearly signposted for drivers.

ALL NEW CARS CAN DRIVE FREELY IN EMISSION ZONES*

Not all Emission Zones apply to private cars; but where they do, it's only older petrol models first registered before 2006 and diesels first registered before September 2015 that are affected.

HOW LOW EMISSION ZONES WORK



1. LOOK FOR SIGNS

Carefully positioned road signs will ensure drivers always know when they are entering an Emission Zone, the hours of operation, vehicles it applies to and any payment required, which can easily be made online. EARLY DRAFT. REQUIRES

2. CHECK


The Emission Zones are categorised by bands from A to D. Band D is the strictest and includes certain (but not all) older private cars, and possibly motorbikes.



If you live inside the zone, you may be eligible for a concession, depending on the local authority.



Vehicles will be checked using automatic number plate recognition cameras. Vehicles that don't pay their charge face a penalty charge.


VEHICLES AFFECTED:

Emission Zones use one of four standard categories to show which vehicles are affected.

Only 'band D' includes certain (but not all) private cars, motorcycles and mopeds:







IS MY CAR AFFECTED?

Not all Emission Zones will apply to private cars; but where they do, it's only older models that are affected.

The following cars can drive freely in Emission Zones*:



All New Cars (this includes all petrol, diesel, hybrid, electric and gas models)



All Petrol Cars First Sold from January 2006 (Euro 4 standard)



All Diesel Cars First Sold from September 2015 (Euro 6 standard) DIFFERENT NAMES FOR EMISSION ZONES
