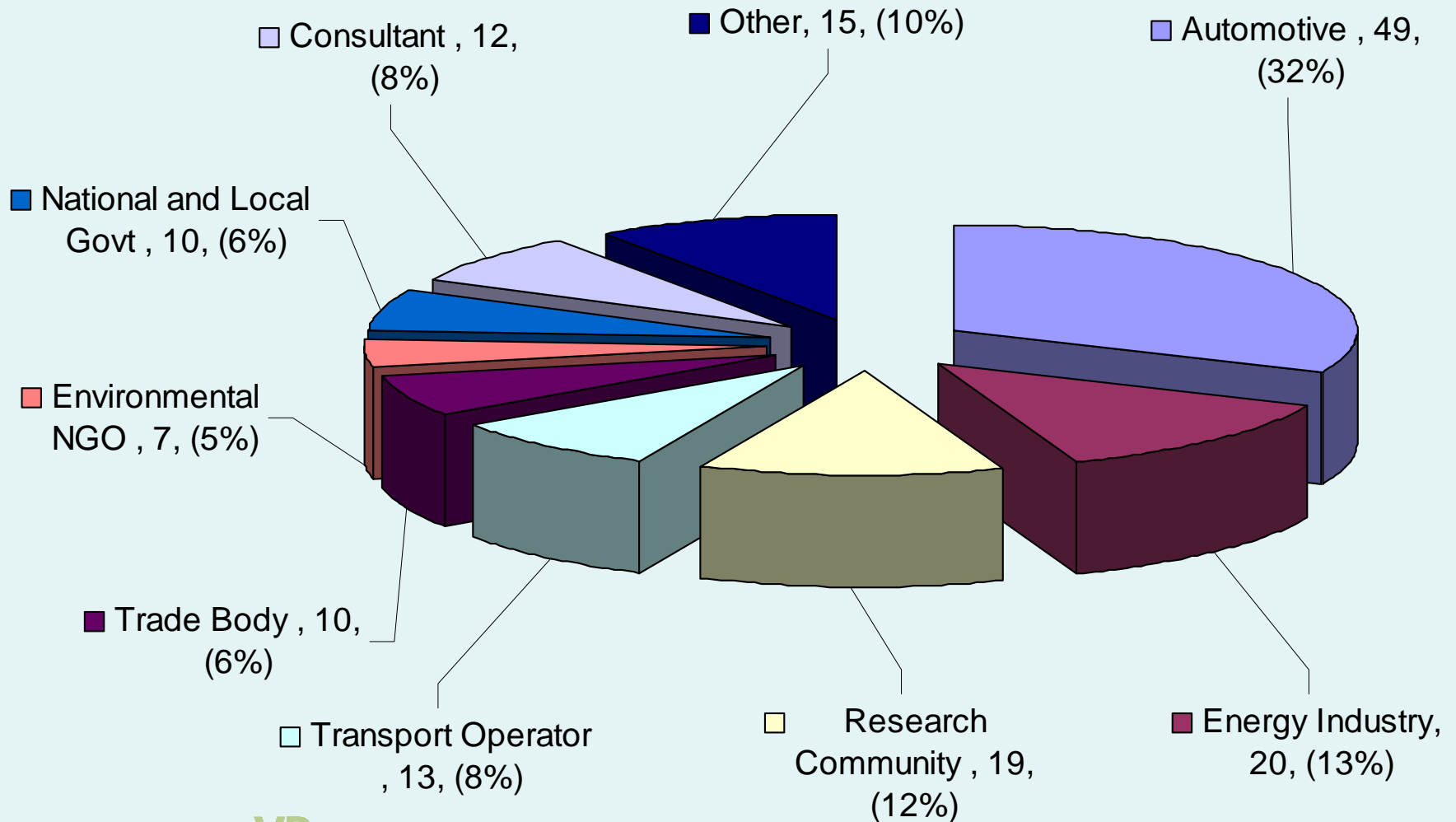

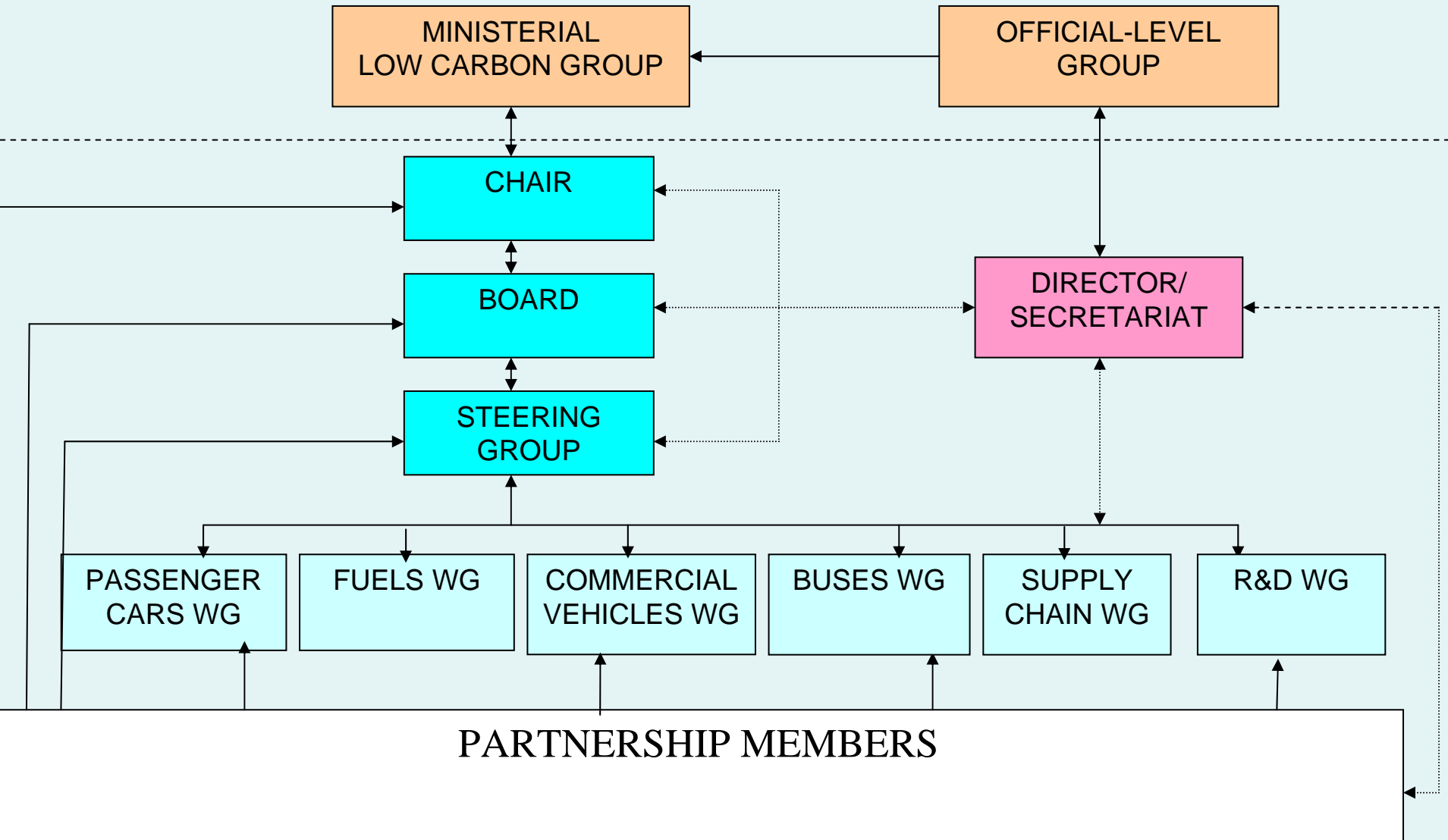

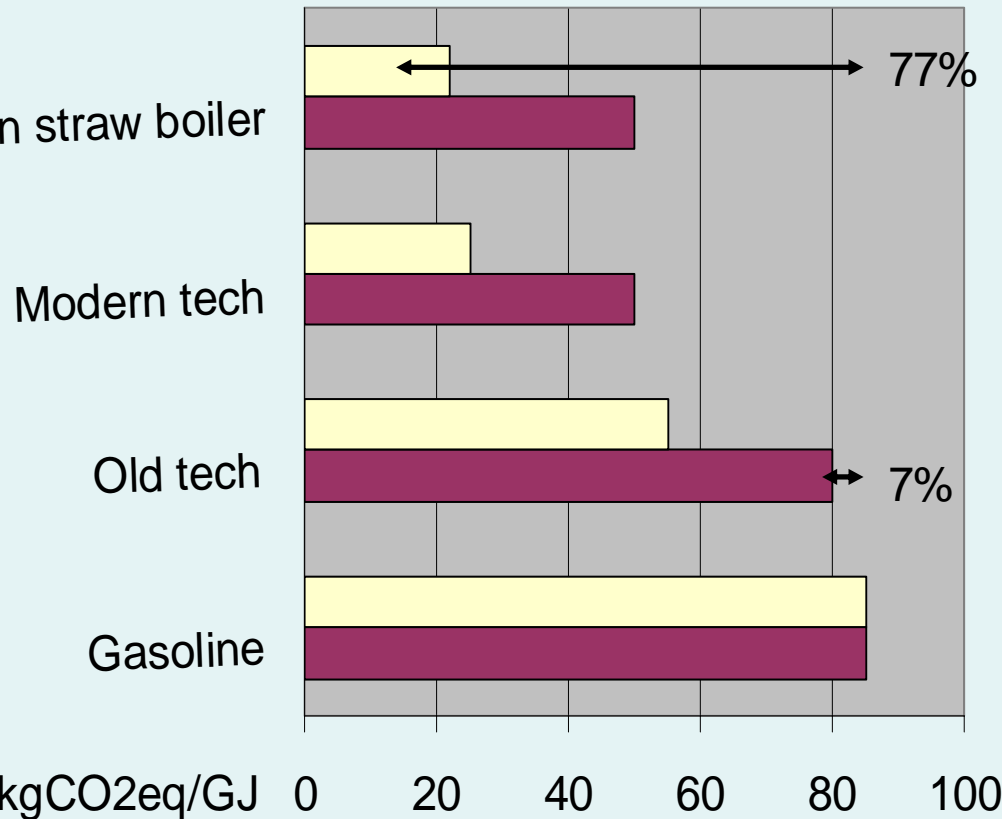
Bioethanol from wheat

C-balance (and cost) of bioethanol production strongly dependant upon

- Fuel production methods
- How by-products such as straw and DDGS are used
