




Labelling and E10 stakeholder working group


A joint DfT - Low CVP group to promote collaboration, allow early identification of issues and provide an efficient base for plans to be developed.

DfT focus -


- 1. The smooth and clear introduction of AFID pump and vehicle labelling
 - Develop consistent messaging to consumers via stakeholders
 - Consult on amending biofuels warning message prior to roll out
 - Deadline for implementation 12 October 2018
- 2. Preparing for the introduction of E10 to the UK market consumer information.
 - Need to be ready as E10 likely in coming years
 - Consumer information vital to any introduction











DfT deliverables, leads and role

▶ Legislative requirement for labelling - DfT

- ▶ Consult on introduction including biofuels warning (and protection grade)
- ▶ Introduce required legislation
- ▶ 12 October 2018 deadline

Develop labelling introduction strategy

- ▶ Facilitate the running of this Labelling/E10 working group
- ▶ Provide Government input and co-ordination to an industry led communications programme

▶ Develop government role on E10

- Ministerial round tables arranged for stakeholders
- ▶ Working group provides forum for discussion and engagement
- ▶ Further E10 specific measures would need Ministerial backing

▶ Consumer information – E10 Compatibility

- ▶ DfT to lead on developing compatibility information cars, motorcycles and other petrol powered equipment.
- Compatibility "Widget"
- ▶ Develop robust evidence base around the impacts of E10

▶ E10 fuel testing

- ▶ Provide part funding and support for further testing on E10 fuel
- Testing programme to be delivered by Low CVP
- ▶ Provide results that can feed into the consumer information piece.
