Domestic transport contributes nearly a quarter of the UK's greenhouse gas emissions. To meet the Government's target of an 80% cut in emissions by 2050, domestic transport must substantially reduce its output over the next decade and beyond.

The 2013 LowCVP Conference will focus on how the changes in how we power our vehicles will impact on policy makers, vehicle and energy suppliers and also address what will need to be done to engage consumers in the process.

Sponsored by EDF and held in association with the Institution of Mechanical Engineers (IMechE), the event will focus around the theme which was introduced at the LowCVP's Tenth Anniversary event held in January.

The LowCVP will introduce a new report, proposing early steps needed on a pathway to a life-cycle approach for measuring emissions from road transport, and discussing the challenges facing all stakeholders.
