

FROM WESTMINSTER TO WELSHPOOL - DELIVERING NET ZERO TRANSPORT REQUIRES COLLABORATION ACROSS ALL KEY AGENCIES OF GOVERNMENT AND INDUSTRY

With a new Government in place, the UK's transport decarbonisation transition is moving into a key delivery phase.

Now more than ever, unprecedented collaboration will be required between all tiers of government, industrial sectors and regions for the UK to achieve its net zero transport goals.

The Summit follows September's publication by Zemo Partnership of <u>guidance</u> <u>setting out seven key principles</u> to inform transport policy development. The guidance has been informed by the independent <u>Council for Net Zero Transport</u>, chaired by Lord Deben which Zemo Partnership convenes. The Council comprises leading representatives of organisations with a key stake in transport's decarbonisation transition.
