## **Encourage R, D&D in low carbon buses**

- Establish a low carbon transport innovation platform
- Grant support for demonstration
- Greater use of the Forward Commitment

## Support the introduction of low carbon buses

- National demonstration of low carbon buses
- Reform or supplement of BSOG
- Empowerment of Local Authorities

### Stimulate the market for low carbon buses

- Taxation system amended to provide meaningful incentives
- Encourage public sector bodies to purchase low carbon vehicles

#### Milestone for demonstration

□ 100 or more low carbon buses demonstrated in the UK by 2009.

#### Shifting to low carbon buses

600 or more low carbon buses coming into operation per year by 2012.


#### **Motivating future improvements**

## Forward Commitment Proposition

- An organisation/s commits to purchase a pre-defined quantity of a product\technology currently under development but not yet available as a commercial offering
- The commitment is for a future date and is based on a specified product performance being achieved
- The supply of a product meeting this performance specification within the agreed timeframes and framework triggers the Forward Commitment
- The Forward Commitment is for a quantity of product sufficient to encourage supplier investment to ensure economies-of-scale
- The Forward Commitment is enacted within the usual framework of best practice public procurement

## *Feasibility study to be undertaken in Q1* 2006

Establish customer interest in low carbon bus procurement

- Establish if there is an unmet need
- Establish contractual structure backing LCB Forward Commitment
  - Back to back contracts relating to bus services and bus procurement
- Low carbon bus specification
  - Develop draft specification, consider potential for common European specification

#### Supplier feedback

- Specification, volumes required
- Identify potential sources of financing
  - Central Government funding, local authority controlled funds, other sources.



## Stakeholder engagement

#### PTEs and local authorities

- Identify potential authorities to create the need
- Raise awareness and communicate project objectives
- Routes, park and rides where low carbon buses could be employed

#### Potential purchasers

- Identify potential purchasers
- Raise awareness and communicate project objectives

#### Potential suppliers

- Identify potential suppliers
- Raise awareness and communicate project objectives
- Support consortium development as and where appropriate

## **Consortium Development**

- Establish political driver
  - Recruit PTE's and local authorities
  - Joint declaration to create market need for low carbon buses
- Identify lead contractor
  - Public or private sector body who will procure buses
- Definition of proposition
  - Establish basis for other bus procurers to participate
  - Engage with trade media to assist in recruitment and publicise to supply chain
- Sourcing partners
  - LowCVP will facilitate the recruitment of partners
- Develop and agree vehicle specification



## Forward Commitment Delivery

Phase 1: Development and implementation of Procurement Strategy

Prototype development & demonstration

Phase 2: Process of product development, delivery and demonstration

- Batch production
- Field trials independently monitored
- Review and confirmation of performance against targets

**Phase 3:** A clearly articulate outcome to the procurement

- Forward commitment triggered or not triggered
- If triggered supply of production vehicles commences



## Feasibility Study

Recruiting participants

- Manufacturers well represented
- Mersey Travel agreed to champion with PTE's
- TfL agreed to keep close tabs on and participate in drafting specification
- Need to recruit bus operators
- Next steps
  - Complete recruiting participants
  - Divide responsibilities / hold workshop
  - Produce first draft for review by sub-group
